Welcome to North Delta Baseball!

NDBA is a non-profit society created to provide the children of our community, ages 4 through 18, with the opportunity to play baseball in an environment that promotes and teaches all aspects of the sport of baseball.

Association organizational duties require that registration take place well in advance of the baseball season. Registrations are processed as they are received and where necessary waiting lists are kept.

How to Register

Please complete and submit the required documentation

- Complete the player registration form
- If new player – Provide a photocopy of player's birth certificate
- If residence is outside of North Delta we will need a release signed by current association President (required every year)
- Enclose complete payment (Player Registration plus fundraising)
- Enclose post-dated cheques for June 01, 2010 (Concession and uniform deposits)

What do you Registration Fees Cover

- Uniforms and Equipment
- Membership in governing associations
- Insurance for players, coaches, umpires
- Umpire payments
- Association administration

Team Placement – Blast ball and T-ball only

If you would like to request a team placement, a separate letter stating specific reasons must accompany this registration form. Both families must submit a separate letter. NDBA cannot guarantee that all requests will be granted.

Coaching and Other Volunteer Duties

NDBA is run by volunteers and our association is always looking for new people. NDBA hosts coaching clinics designed to help the coaches prepare for this challenging but rewarding position. If you are interested, check the Team Manager or Team Coach box on the application. All Coaches, Managers and Executive must have an annual criminal record check done by the Delta Police.

Refund Policy

All refunds are subject to a \$25 processing fee (except Blast ball)

Refunds must be requested in writing. No refunds will be processed until after April 15th, 2010.

Refunds issued for Medical Reasons (with Doctor's certificate) may have fee waived.

The Baseball Season

The Regular Spring baseball season runs from early April until late June.

Player evaluations will be held in late February.

Summer ball seasons are available for Tadpole through Midget AA. (Bantam AAA, Midget AAA and Midget Premier Run full seasons, April through July)

Tryouts for summer ball are usually held at the conclusion of the spring season.

Provincial, Western and National Tournaments are held in August for summer teams that qualify.

There are additional fees collected for summer ball, once teams are selected. (\$50. For Tadpole, \$75 for Mosquito and Pee wee and \$100 for Bantam and Midget)

North Delta Blue Jays/Jr Jays – Midget Premier

The North Delta Blue Jays are a premier Midget team who compete in the Premier Baseball League and are members of NDBA. The Jr Jays are affiliated with the Senior Blue Jay team and compete in the BCJPBL.

The Blue Jays (Sr and Jr) hold their tryout through the fall ball season. (Sept-Oct) They workout and train throughout the year, with exhibition games beginning as early as January. The PBL/JPBL regular season runs from April through July.

Fund Raising Policy

NDBA does not allow fundraising by individual teams, unless they are travelling outside of the lower mainland. Application must be made and approval must be granted allowing fundraising by individual teams, with specific purposes noted in the application.

Please Note

- Families with three children or more registered with NDBA, will pay only \$50. For the third and subsequent child(ren).
- NSF cheques will be subject to a \$25 charge
- The custodial parent is responsible for signing all forms and for all financial responsibilities
- The custodial parent's residential address determines eligibility to play in NDBA
