No Shows

No shows are subject to disciplinary action. Multiple no shows will result in the possibility of suspension or termination from the umpiring body. Sole authority will be on the Umpire-In-Chief to administer such escalations with determinations forwarded to the NDBA Executive.

Lates

Lates are subject to disciplinary action. Multiple lates will result in the possibility of suspension or termination from the umpiring body. Sole authority will be on the Umpire-In-Chief to administer such escalations with determinations forwarded to the NDBA Executive.

One Man Umpiring/Less Than The Preferred Number Of Umpires At A Game

For a game to proceed at least one official (BCBUA carded for the current year) umpire must be in attendance at the game and on the field of play, if this is not met the game will be declared unplayable and the Division Coordinator and the Umpire-In-Chief will be notified. If one official umpire is in attendance at the game and on the field of play, the game may proceed and a staff (NOT BCBUA carded for the current year, parent, sibling, etc.) umpire, agreeable by both managers and the official umpire, may be used to fill up to the required number of umpires at a game. For application of this rule Level 1 umpires must accept the assistance of a staff umpire if offered and agreed upon by the managers, whereas a Level 2 umpire may refuse the assistance of a staff umpire at their discretion. Staff umpires are eligible for compensation at the rate of 1 Bases Fee for the level worked. If the official umpire works solo for the entire game they are eligible for compensation at the rate of 1 Plate Fee + ½ Bases Fee for the level worked.
